

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 2023 <u>Treasurer's Report</u>

Greetings to all in the Chrysalis community

We are a community learning together and growing together to inspire individuals within a nurturing, learning community so they can live a connected and purposeful life. A place of belonging where the child, parent, staff and the broader community can come together.

For the past year we have continued to experience a steady financial position which enables us to continue with ongoing future planning at Chrysalis.

Capital Expenditure 2022

The capital expenditure was applied to school improvements being the school toilets refurbishment which was completed during the year adding a new staff toilet, refurbishing the two existing staff toilets and four student primary toilets.

Playground

Multi-use Sports court which was re-surfaced at the end of the year with court lines for basketball and netball is now being enjoyed by the children. In this phase we upgraded the reticulation and added new lawn to the back and also to the middle of the playground along the new retainer wall.

A new shed was installed for the Children House student's bikes which are very popular among the younger children.

Financial Statements

The audit of the 2022 financial statements has been concluded with no adverse findings. The audited Financial Statements are included for your information.

We have been fortunate to be in a position to increase fees slightly in the past few years, though given higher inflationary pressures an increase of 3% fee was applied in 2023.

Key statistics for the year ended 31 December 2022 - Income

Fees contributed 52% of the total income, broadly in line with the previous year. There was no increase to the school fees in 2021, 2022 there was a 2% increase and the current fees in 2023 have been increased by 3%.

Grants contribute 43% of the total income and continued in line with previous years.

Recurrent Grants were received from both State and Federal governments, based on enrolment numbers (school census - in February and August for State Funding for KK to Yr 6 and in August for Federal Funding for PP to Yr 6 students).



To receive these grants the school must meet certain requirements:

- Registration –due for renewal in 2023.
- Participation in NAPLAN
- Reporting to parents twice a year
- Approved Curriculum

Key statistics for the year ended 31 December 2022 – Expenditure

Employee salaries expenses have continued to be around 80% of total expenses in 2022 due to:

- Staff wages being maintained in line with Teachers and Education Assistant awards as part of Chrysalis Workplace Agreements.
- Specialist Art Program in 2022
- Wellness Program
- Increase in Maintenance personal
- Increase in Cleaning and Sanitising

Services that reflect and build community:

- Playgroup provides a gentle introduction to Chrysalis and acts as a 'feeder' for Children's House. Unfortunately last year Playgroup was closed for Semester One and was reopened in Term 3 of 2022. Playgroup continues with strong attendance for the remaining of the year.
- Before and After School Care, Montessori based program continues to enrich the love of learning and belonging for Chrysalis students and gives support to parents. This service has not had a fee increase for 4 years and due to increases overall a 5% increase has been applied in March 2023.
- Chrysalis School Extended Day Program for children who are half day in Children's House.
- The Fundraising Levy (\$100 per year per family approx. \$10,000) went towards:
 - Classroom Equipment
 - Classroom carpet
 - Playground Equipment
 - Music Equipment
 - Furniture for the Classroom
 - Montessori Equipment
 - Classroom shelving
